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**How the real GL Assessment 11+ works.** GL Assessment is the default 11+ test provider in most grammar school areas, including Kent, Buckinghamshire, Birmingham, Warwickshire, Trafford and parts of Lincolnshire and Essex. It is a paper-based test, mostly multiple-choice, with a separate answer sheet, and each area or school chooses its own mix of subjects. It is sat in September of Year 6, usually at the child's own primary school.

Inside, the runner beans had climbed higher than his head, and the smell of turned soil and tomato leaves hung thick in the warm air. Grandad lowered himself onto the old bench with a small, private sigh, the 10. one he thought nobody noticed, and watched Marcus find the trowel without being told where it was kept. "Right then," Grandad said, "show me what you remember."

## English answers

- Q1 • B** The passage opens by explaining that Grandad "had never once let anyone else carry the allotment key", so pressing it into Marcus's palm marked a clear change.
- Q2 • A** Grandad says he needs both hands for the wheelbarrow, "which was true, but it was not the real reason and they both knew it."
- Q3 • C** The passage immediately explains this: it was "the one he thought nobody noticed", meaning the sigh was quiet and not meant to be seen.
- Q4 • B** Knowing exactly where the trowel is kept, with no instruction needed, suggests Marcus has spent enough time at the allotment to already know his way around it.
- Q5 • B** Handing over the key and then asking Marcus to "show me what you remember" frames this as a moment of trust: Grandad is letting Marcus demonstrate what he has already learned.
- Q6 • B** "Group" is a singular collective noun here, so it takes the singular verb "was", even though it refers to several people.
- Q7 • B** "Gardener's" correctly shows singular possession (the tools belonging to one gardener) with the apostrophe before the s.
- Q8 • B** The word describes how the seedlings grew, so it needs to be an adverb: "quickly", not the adjective "quick".
- Q9 • C** Only "Grandad watered the beans every evening" has a subject and a full verb and expresses a complete thought. The others are sentence fragments.
- Q10 • B** Vegetable has an "e" after the "g": ve-ge-ta-ble.
- Q11 • C** A formal letter to a council calls for formal register. "I am writing to request that my allotment plot be renewed" avoids slang and informal phrasing.

## Mathematics answers

- Q1 • D** 5 is in the thousands column of 258,431, so its value is 5,000.
- Q2 • B** Multiplication is done before addition and subtraction:  $6 \times 5 = 30$ . Then  $9 + 30 - 7 = 32$ .
- Q3 • A** A common denominator of 6 gives  $\frac{4}{6} + \frac{1}{6} = \frac{5}{6}$ , which is already in simplest form.
- Q4 • B** 25% is a quarter, so  $72 \div 4 = 18$ .
- Q5 • C** 1 kilogram = 1,000 g, so  $3.2 \text{ kg} = 3.2 \times 1,000 = 3,200 \text{ g}$ .
- Q6 • B** Angles in a triangle total  $180^\circ$ .  $180 - 55 - 72 = 53^\circ$ .
- Q7 • B** Add the numbers:  $8 + 14 + 22 + 10 + 16 = 70$ . Divide by how many there are (5): 14.
- Q8 • B**  $5 \times \text{£}4.2 = \text{£}21.00$ . A 10% discount means she pays 90%:  $\text{£}21.00 \times 0.9 = \text{£}18.90$ .
- Q9 • B** 48 shared into  $5 + 3 = 8$  parts is 6 per part. Tulips are the larger share, 5 parts:  $5 \times 6 = 30$ .
- Q10 • B** 7 squared is 49, then  $49 - 5 = 44$ .

## Verbal Reasoning answers

- Q1 • A** The rule is each letter moves 3 places forward in the alphabet. This gives O.
- Q2 • A** The rule is each letter moves 3 places back in the alphabet. This gives M.
- Q3 • A** The rule is the gap between letters grows by one each time: +2, +3, +4, then +5. This gives P.
- Q4 • A** The rule is double the number, then add 1, giving 79.
- Q5 • A** The rule is the amount added grows by 2 each time: +5, +7, +9, then +11, giving 35.
- Q6 • A** The rule is the amount subtracted shrinks by 1 each time: -9, -8, -7, then -6, giving 60.
- Q7 • B** "Ancient" means very old, and "age-old" is the closest match in meaning among the options.
- Q8 • B** "Reluctant" means unwilling or hesitant to do something, which matches "unwilling" most closely.
- Q9 • C** "Generous" means willing to give freely, and "selfish" (only thinking of oneself) is its clearest opposite.
- Q10 • B** A chef works in a kitchen, and a pilot works in a cockpit. Both pairs link a worker to the specific space they operate in.
- Q11 • C** A petal is one part that makes up a flower, and a page is one part that makes up a book.



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
